The Carter Report highlighted the need to save money by using technology to improve processes in the NHS. To achieve this, NHS trusts must first understand where they are now in comparison to their peers then carefully plan how to make realistic steps towards fully digitised patient records and paperless processes. 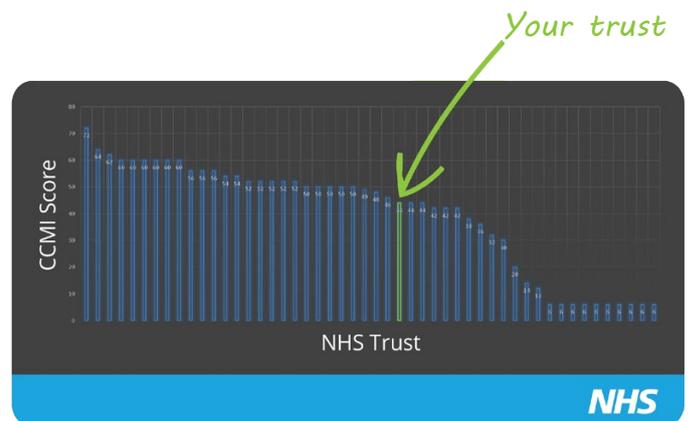

What is the Winscribe CCMI?

The Winscribe Clinical Correspondence Maturity Index (CCMI) is a NHS efficiency indicator created to allow NHS Management Boards and CCGs to measure the efficiency of their Clinical Correspondence processes as compared to their peers in the NHS. This index provides NHS trusts and CCGs with insight to where efficiencies can be gained in the future by the application of proven technology to support CIPs with targeted transformation projects.

Winscribe have partnered with over 90 NHS trusts, facilitating cost improvement schemes and helping trusts to gain lasting benefits and continuous savings via proven software solutions. One of our NHS partners, based in the Midlands, is currently saving £1.2 million annually following the implementation of an Outpatient Workflow and Speech Recognition solution. This trust scores highly on the CCMI as a result, but it is clear that there are still more savings to be made in the future.

The Winscribe CCMI allows NHS trusts to define the current maturity level of their Clinical Correspondence processes and give them recommendations on what technology to take on next in order to achieve their set goals.

How does the CCMI work?

Over the many years of working with NHS trusts, we have developed a set of criteria that help us define precisely which technologies can combine to create more efficient processes. Each trust is very different and the path forward is often dependent on a combination of existing solutions and planned future procurements. The CCMI is a starting point for discussions on the best technology strategy forward to achieve the trust's cost saving and efficiency targets.

Our consultants walk trusts through the steps needed for them to ascend the CCMI index over time as their processes improve. Our consultants can also conduct a detailed efficiency review in key departments that will highlight some important areas where savings can be made. This review often assists Transformation Teams in building the internal business case for change in line with other projects. This process has the added advantage of revealing many of the existing manual workarounds that reinforce paper-based and analogue processes and identify the strategies that will reduce dependence on paper.

CCMI extras

An important component of the CCMI is the recommendations and insight provided, helping a trust to understand the 'cost per document' calculation, which gives trust management a good idea of their costs right now and how these can be reduced by scoring higher on the CCMI.
